GENERAL INFORMATION

PURPOSE AND VISION OF CCFBC

We desire to see each student at Cross Christian Fellowship Bible College becoming totally committed and abandoned to Jesus Christ, while being separated from the world and the fleshly life of self. Our vision is to have each student conformed into the image of Jesus Christ, thus having the life of Christ living through them by the power of the Holy Spirit. (Rom. 12:1-2; 2 Cor. 5:14-15; Eph. 4:17-20; Phil. 1:21)

Then He said to them all, "If anyone desires to come after Me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow Me. For whoever desires to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for My sake will save it." (Luke 9:23-24)

We desire to see each student grow in godliness and holiness. (Rom. 8:29; Gal. 4:19; 2 Cor. 3:18; 1 Pe. 2:4-5)

Let us walk properly, as in the day, not in revelry and drunkenness, not in lewdness and lust, not in strife and envy. But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to fulfill its lust. (Rom. 13:13-14)

And whoever desires to be first among you, let him be your slave; just as the Son of Man did not come to be served, but to serve, and to give His life a ransom for many. (Matt. 20:27-28)

THEOLOGY CONTINUED

PAUL'S EPISTLES I: EPHESIANS (4 Credits)

A look at Pauline theology as it is applied to the Church of Jesus Christ. The student will gain insight into the believer's position in Christ, principles of practical godly living, and teaching regarding the Church's purpose and function.

PAUL'S EPISTLES VI: ROMANS (4 Credits)

A comprehensive exposition of this vital New Testament epistle. It illuminates and explains the unfolding of the evangelical faith as embodied in Pauline theology. It will challenge each student to carefully explore the Scriptures for the foundations of their theology. The Epistles to the Romans is the most systematic of Paul's epistles and will help thoroughly establish the believer in the Christian faith.

CULTS AND COMPARATIVE RELIGIONS (4 Credits)

A clear and concise course that will provide the Christian with practical insight into a comprehensive analysis of today's cults, occult and non-Christian religions. An analysis will be given on each of the major cult's doctrines and traditions, as well as a biblical refutation of their errors. Several of the non-Christian religions, Judaism, Islam & Hinduism, will be discussed as well.

BIBLICAL APOLOGETICS (4 Credits)

This course is designed for those who would like to know how to defend the faith more effectively. Time will be given to effective methods of witnessing, as well as how to answer difficult questions proposed by non-believers. Time will also be given for the consideration of difficult passages of the Scriptures, evolution and Science and the Bible.

PCM1-8: Practical Christian Ministry (1 credit Each)

- Required for all certificates—No Cost

Students will provide 1 hour weekly of practical support to the many areas at Cross Christian Fellowship or their home church. Opportunities include working with the Bible college, lending library, men's ministry, sound ministry, outreach ministries, radio ministry, missions, children's ministry and many other areas of ministry.

COURSE INFORMATION CONTINUED

THEOLOGY CERTIFICATE REQUIRED CLASSES

BASIC CHRISTIAN DOCTRINES I (4 Credits)

A systematic teaching which provides a tremendous resource for all who seek to know sound doctrine which can be worked out into the realities of life and ministry. This course is designed for those who desire a thorough understanding of the doctrines of the Bible. This quarter of Systematic Theology will cover: 1) Bible, 2) Angels and 3) Church.

BASIC CHRISTIAN DOCTRINES II (4 Credits)

This quarter of Basic Doctrines will cover: 1) God - His attributes, names, and nature, as well as the doctrine of the Trinity, 2) The Deity of Jesus Christ - Scriptural substantiating His divine nature and attributes, and 3) The Holy Spirit - looking at His work and ministry.

***Basic Christian Doctrines I is not required to take this course.**

BASIC CHRISTIAN DOCTRINES III (4 Credits)

The third session of the four-part study of the doctrines of the Christian faith. This quarter will cover: 1) the doctrines of man, 2) the doctrine of sin, and 3) God's plan of salvation. For additional information, see course description listed under Quarter I.

***Basic Christian Doctrines I –II is not required to take this course.**

BASIC CHRISTIAN DOCTRINES IV (4 Credits)

A systematic teaching which provides a tremendous resource for all who seek to know sound doctrine which can be worked out into the realities of life and ministry. This is the final session in the four-part study of doctrine. This quarter will deal with the study of Biblical prophecy. This course is designed to treat Bible Prophecy (Eschatology) as a biblical doctrine. The student will learn methods and considerations of interpretation, as well as past, present and future prophecies.

***Basic Christian Doctrines I –III is not required to take this course.**

We desire to see each student dependent upon the enabling work of the Holy Spirit in their lives, and having no confidence in the flesh. (John 4:24; 6:63; 7:37-39; 15:5; 16:13-14; Acts 1:8; 2 Cor. 3:5-6; Eph. 5:18; Phil. 3:3)

ACCREDITATION

At this time CCFBC has decided not to seek accreditation so as to remain free from outside control and open to the leading of the Holy Spirit.

MINISTRY TRAINING

The Bible College is designed to grow each Christian in knowledge and wisdom in the study of the Word of God and ministry.

In addition to course work, CCFBC provides on-going opportunities to minister within CCF and possibly other churches in order to gain practical ministry experience.

Some common areas of ministry which have developed over the years are: outreach ministry, hospital ministry, feeding the homeless, children's Christian education, audio and radio ministry, street witnessing, new believers instructors, internet ministry, sound ministry, and youth group involvement. The opportunities change each quarter

MORAL CODE

Along with scholastic standards we hold to Biblically moral standards. While you are in attendance at the College we ask compliance to Biblical virtues.

As far as clothing is concerned, we ask the students not to wear pants that are low riding on the hips, and that all apparel be modest and appropriate. We appreciate your cooperation as we are seeking to honor God.

This is a non-smoking facility and there are no designated areas for smokers on or near the campus. This rule will be strictly enforced. Dress and conduct violations will be grounds for dismissal.

BIBLE CONTINUED

LIFE OF CHRIST I (4 Credits)

This course is the first in a two-part study, reconstructing the life and teachings of Jesus Christ the Messiah as taken from the Gospel of Luke. A full portrait will be presented by considering the other three gospel accounts in order to gain additional insight. Part I will cover: the events leading to the birth of Christ through first year of public ministry. These teachings provide practical lessons for every student who desires to grow in his/her personal walk with Christ.

PAUL'S EPISTLES II: I CORINTHIANS (4 Credits)

The second course offered as an expository study of Pauline Theology. This quarter examines the first letter of Paul to the Church at Corinth. Paul's letter exposes the tragedy of living in sin and worldliness and applies the positive remedy of the cross of Jesus Christ. Christian maturity is a major benefit of a study of this epistle.

PAUL'S EPISTLES III: PHILIPPIANS AND COLOSSIANS (4 Credits)

The third course offers as an expository study of Pauline Theology. This quarter examines Paul's letters to the Philippian and Colossian Churches. These two short epistles provide an intimate look at Paul's love for his converts (Philippians) as well as his concern for believers who are in danger of being ensnared by destructive false doctrine.

PAUL'S EPISTLES IV: II CORINTHIANS AND GALATIANS (4 Credits)

Examining the letters of Paul to the churches at Corinth and Galatia. Paul's second letter to the Corinthian Church deals with the proper discipline to be exercised within the local church. Paul also teaches on other important subject, such as, Christian maturity and blessings which proceed from trials. Galatians confronts various heretical ideas and establishes the foundations of salvation by grace through faith in Christ. Galatians also presents the proper Biblical balance between Grace and the Law.

PCM1-8: Practical Christian Ministry (1 credit Each) - *Required for all certificates—No Cost*

Students will provide 1 hour weekly of practical support to the many areas at Cross Christian Fellowship or their home church. Opportunities include working with the Bible college, lending library, men's ministry, sound ministry, outreach ministries, radio ministry, missions, children's ministry and many other areas of ministry.

COURSE INFORMATION CONTINUED

BIBLE CERTIFICATE REQUIRED CLASSES

BIBLE SURVEY - OLD TESTAMENT (4 Credits)

A panoramic view of the Old Testament that will teach you how the thirty-nine books of the Old Testament fit together, historically, chronologically and poetically. A quick, clear overview covering the people, events, and purpose of each Old Testament book will be discussed. This course is a good introductory course for newer Christians, and is required for all three certificate programs.

BIBLE SURVEY - NEW TESTAMENT (4 Credits)

A comprehensive overview of the New Testament highlighting: the Gospels, historical books, Pauline Epistles and Revelation. A quick clear overview covering the people, events and purposes of each New Testament book will be discussed. This is an excellent course for all Christian, especially the younger believer in Christ, and is strongly recommended for all students to take.

GENERAL EPISTLES I: JAMES, I AND II PETER (4 Credits)

An expository study of the letters of James and Peter to the church. James, as the first church father, gives deep spiritual insight into a variety of doctrinal issues, especially the proper balance between faith and works. Peter's writings focus on the question of suffering in the life of the believer and warnings against false teaching.

GENERAL EPISTLE II: I, II, III JOHN AND JUDE (4 Credits)

Expositions through each epistle written by John and Jude, surveying them verse-by-verse. The Epistles of John emphasize the essentials of Christian maturity. Of all the non-Pauline Epistles, the First Epistle of John gives the richest instruction for growth in Christ. The Epistle of Jude warns believers against false prophets seeking to oppose the faith that has been once and for all delivered to the Body of Christ.

ADMISSIONS

"But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. To Him be the glory both now and forever. Amen." 2 Peter

NEW STUDENTS

If you are interested in attending Cross Christian Fellowship Bible College you must submit an application for admission. This form can be obtained from either the church, Bible College office or by downloading from our website: www.CrossFellowship.org.

CCFBC does not discriminate on the basis of race, age, gender, ethnic background, native language, nationality or physical disability.

Due to the fact that course work is done in English, we require that all students are sufficiently proficient in basic writing, reading, and verbal English skills as a first or second language to enroll.

It is recommended that you apply at least two months prior to the beginning of the quarter, that way the staff will have enough time to review and approve your application before registration for classes begins. CCFBC will usually notify students of a decision within a few weeks of receiving the application.

Incomplete applications cannot be processed until all information is received.

FINANCIAL

REGISTRATION

Registration for Bible College can be done by mail or in person after any service prior to the start of the school year. If you have a past-due balance from any previous quarter, arrangements for payments must be made with the Bible College staff and with the approval of the Bible College director before being allowed continuance in the program.

The last day of registration is the Sunday after classes begin.

TUITION & FEES

APPLICATION FEE

There is a non-refundable application fee of \$25.00 for all students to be submitted with your application.

TUITION & BOOK FEES ETC.

The tuition fee for students attending classes at Cross Fellowship Bible College is \$100.00 per class. Registration and tuition fees do not include the cost of books and supplies, which average \$15 to \$25 per quarter.

Possible practicum costs are separate and may be announced throughout the school year but are not mandatory.

Possible retreat and conference costs and may be announced in the school year but are not mandatory. There may be opportunity to travel to a Pastor and Leader conference at the student's expense.

MINISTRY CONTINUED

PAUL'S EPISTLES V: THE PASTORAL EPISTLES (4 Credits)

This course will cover the Pastoral Epistles (I and II Timothy and Titus) in a verse-by-verse exposition. These epistles provide an insight to Paul's heart for ministry. This study provides a careful study of the basic structure of Christian ministry and leadership.

THE LIFE OF MOSES (4 Credits)

A study of one of the most prominent men in the Old Testament. No other person prefigures the ministry of Christ in the Old Testament as does Moses. Special emphasis will be placed on God's preparation and use of Moses in leading Israel to the Promised Land. Exodus through Deuteronomy will serve as the background for this course.

THE LIFE OF PAUL THE APOSTLE (4 Credits)

A Study of the life, ministry, and theology of Paul, the Apostle. Special emphasis will be given to themes such as the call to ministry, the training of church leadership, missions, and Pauline theology.

INTRODUCTION TO BIBLE STUDY METHODS (4 Credits)

This course is designed to give insight into the various methods of Bible study for the layman. It is a prerequisite to Advanced Bible Study Methods. This course introduces the student to various Bible study tools with a special emphasis on Hebrew and Greek word studies and the basic principles of the Inductive Bible Study Method.

INTRODUCTION TO TEACHING (4 Credits)

This course is designed for those individuals who feel a calling or are presently involved in a teaching capacity. Emphasis will be placed on learning the transition from Bible study (provided in the Introduction to Bible Study Methods course) using the Inductive Method to sermon preparation and delivery.

***Introduction To Bible Study Methods must be taken prior to enrolling for this course.**

PCM1-8: Practical Christian Ministry (1 credit Each)

- Required for all certificates—No Cost

Students will provide 1 hour weekly of practical support to the many areas at Cross Christian Fellowship or their home church. Opportunities include working with the Bible college, lending library, men's ministry, sound ministry, outreach ministries, radio ministry, missions, children's ministry and many other areas of ministry.

COURSE INFORMATION

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

MINISTRY CERTIFICATE REQUIRED CLASSES

PRACTICAL CHRISTIAN LIVING I (4 Credits)

The first of two courses that deal with basic but essential areas of the Christian walk. The course emphasizes the importance of practical application of the Word of God into one's daily life. This quarter's topics include: Christian Ethics and Integrity, Intimacy with God, and Decision Making & The Will of God.

PRACTICAL CHRISTIAN LIVING II (4 Credits)

The concluding course that deals with basic, but essential areas of the Christian walk. The course emphasizes the importance of practical application of the Word of God into one's daily life. This quarter's topics include: Christian Marriage, Financial Integrity, and The Effective Prayer Life.

***Practical Christian Living I is not required to take this course.**

THE BOOK OF ACTS (4 Credits)

A vivid study of Christianity's early days as reflected in the historical book of Acts. A foundational study of this book is imperative in order to fully comprehend the New Testament as a whole. Acts gives us the beginning and expansion of the New Testament Church in the age of grace. We will cover all twenty-eight chapters systematically and compare various New Testament epistles to give the student a comprehensive understanding of this important book.

PAYMENT TERMS

All required fees and 100% of the total course tuition for the quarter are due at the time of the first day of class. This will be \$100 per class but books, application fee and media will be extra. Payments can be made by cash, check or money order payable to **Cross Christian Fellowship**. Your Debit Card, Visa or MasterCard may be used for payment at class.

REFUNDS.....

Complete refunds of tuition can only happen prior to a quarter starting. Once a quarter has started no refunds will be offered. No refunds will be offered for any prior quarters attended.

Refunds are contingent upon proper notification by the student. The student must notify the Bible College, either in writing, by phone, or in person. It is important that you notify the Bible College as soon as you decide to drop a quarter since your refund amount is determined according to the day that you give notice.

FINANCIAL AID

Because of the low cost requirements no financial aid is offered to attendees of the Bible College .

GRADING SYSTEM

While grades are not the main goal of our classes, evaluation is an important tool in teaching and discipleship training. We recognize that, although all people are equal in value, they often differ in their gifts and abilities. As we design our courses and evaluate students' work, we do our best to make sure that students receive grades that properly reflect the effort they put into their studies.

At CCF Bible College, we use both letter grades and grade points that count toward a cumulative Grade Point Average (GPA). This standard grading system makes it easier for our students to transfer credits from CCGS Bible College to other academic institutions, and applies uniformly to all courses.

ATTENDANCE

Each student will be responsible for contacting the teacher aid or Bible College staff when absent to order the class recording at the appropriate cost.

A student may be dismissed if they incur more than three unexcused absences in a single class per Bible College quarter.

REQUIRED COURSES FOR CERTIFICATES

The Certificate of Ministry - 40 Credits

This is a two-year program intended for students who desire to understand the intricacies of ministry. Students must take all the required courses and complete all required work and studies. The required courses are as follows: Practical Christian Ministry 1 through 8, Book of Acts, Paul's Epistles V, Life of Moses, Life of Paul, Practical Christian Living I & II, Intro to Bible study, and Intro to teaching.

The Certificate of Theology - 40 Credits

This is a two-year program intended for students who desire to understand God and His main attributes. Students must take all the required courses and complete all required work and studies. The required courses are as follows: Practical Christian Ministry 1 through 8, Basic Christian Doctrines 1 through 4, Paul's Epistles I & V, Cults and Comparative Religions, Biblical Apologetics.

The Certificate of Bible Study - 40 Credits

This is a two-year program intended for students who desire to grow in their personal knowledge of the Word of God. Students must take all the required courses and complete all required work and studies. The required courses are as follows: Practical Christian Ministry 1 through 8, Bible Survey Old and New Testament, General Epistles I & II, Life of Christ, Paul's Epistles II, III & IV,

NOTE: Completion of Practical Christian Ministry is required to receive any of the above certificates and to graduate.

STATEMENT OF FAITH

Bible: We believe the Bible to be the inspired, the only infallible, authoritative, inerrant Word of God. (2 Timothy 3:15-17; 2 Peter 1:21).

God: We believe there is one God, eternally existent in three persons: Father, Son and Holy Spirit. (Genesis 1:1; Deuteronomy 6:4; Matthew 28:19; John 10:30)

Jesus: We believe in the deity of Christ (John 10:33); His virgin birth (Isaiah 7:14; Matthew 1:23; Luke 1:34-35); His sinless life (Hebrews 4:15, 7:26); His miracles (John 2:11); His vicarious and atoning death (1 Corinthians 15:3; Ephesians 1:7; Hebrews 2:9); His physical bodily resurrection (John 11:25; 1 Corinthians 15:4); His ascension to the right hand of the Father (Mark 16:19); His personal return to earth in power and glory. (Acts 1:11; Revelation 19:11-16)

Spirit: We believe in the present ministry of the Holy Spirit including the orderly demonstration of His gifts and by whose indwelling the Christian is enabled to live a godly life. (Romans 8:13-14; 1 Corinthians 3:16, 6:19-20; Ephesians 4:30, 5:18)

Salvation: We believe in the regeneration by the Holy Spirit during salvation because of the sinfulness of human nature, and that all are justified on the single ground of faith in the shed blood of Christ, and that only by God's grace, through faith alone, are we saved. (John 3:16-19; 5:24; Romans 3:23, 5:8-9; Ephesians 2:8-10; Titus 3:5) We believe in God's sovereignty and man's free will.

Resurrection: We believe in the resurrection of both the saved and the lost; they that are saved unto the resurrection of life, and they that are not unto the resurrection of damnation. (John 5:28-29)

Church: We believe in the spiritual unity of believers in our Lord Jesus Christ. (1 Corinthians 12:12-13) We believe in the present gifts of the Holy Spirit operating in an proper and orderly manner. (1 Cor. 12-14)

Christ's Return: We await the imminent rapture of the church and the second coming of Christ which will be physical, personal, visible, and pre-millennial. This motivates us to holy living, heart-felt worship, committed service, diligent study of God's Word, evangelism, and regular fellowship.

STATEMENT OF FAITH CONTINUED

We Reject: (1) The belief that true Christians can be demon possessed;
 (2) any theology which denies that human freewill can be exercised in the receiving of Christ's free gift of salvation; specifically, we reject the belief that Jesus' atonement was limited in its extent, instead, we believe that He died for all unrighteous people and we reject the assertion that God's wooing grace cannot be resisted or that He has elected some people to go to hell; instead we believe that anyone who wills to come to Christ may do so freely as a result of the Holy Spirit's conviction and wooing persuasion of the heart;
 (3) "positive confession," (e.g., the Faith Movement, that views faith as a force that can create one's own reality or that God can be commanded to heal or work miracles according to man's will and faith);
 (4) human prophecy that supersedes, or is contrary to, the Scripture;
 (5) any introduction of psychology and philosophy which is contrary to Scripture and is in substance "according to the tradition of men, according to the basic principles of the world, and not according to Christ" into biblical teaching;
 (6) "Open Theism" or "Freewill Theism" which reduces God's timeless, unchanging, dynamic nature, and exhaustive foreknowledge of future free decisions, to creaturely modes of being and operation;
 (7) the "Emergent Church" movement insofar as it departs from the historic orthodox Christian doctrines in favor of postmodernism;
 (8) the overemphasis of spiritual gifts, experiential signs and wonders to the exclusion of biblical teaching.
